PREPARING FOR 2025

All students require a **stationary pack** for 2025. Stationary packs can be ordered through the Maxim Office bookpack portal. The portal will close on **Friday 15th December**. The School Saving Bonus cannot be allocated to Maxim Office Group to use against stationary.

The **School Saving Bonus** is available for parents and carers of all Victorian government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025, except for full-fee international students, home schooled students, TAFE students and students attending kindergarten in 2025.

The bonus can be used towards 2025 school costs, which may include:

- camps, trips, excursions and incursions
- · swimming and sporting programs
- school uniforms

Any amount that you choose to allocate to activities and uniforms will be valid until 30 June 2025. It will then transfer to your child's school account for future activities. 
Hello Everyone!


