DOGS IN SCHOOL POLICY



Our Dogs in School Policy was updated in Term Four last year. Please note that our policy states that dogs are allowed onsite under the conditions that they are on a lead, under the control of an adult. Dogs are not permitted to be left unattended/tied up unsupervised and are not permitted in the school buildings. We do have some students who are particularly anxious around dogs and families who have expressed concern about dogs in our yard.

Department guidelines allow for a choice of two policies, the one that we have adopted allowing dogs onsite as we understand how connected our community is to their canine friends. The other option is to have a ban on dogs onsite altogether. We ask our community to please observe the conditions of the policy so that we can continue to enjoy safe interactions with a variety of dogs.

PLAYGROUND UPGRADE

We are so excited to have the works beginning on our brand new playground at the front of the school this coming week. Our existing playground has served us well but is well overdue for an overhaul. Our 2024 School Captains did a great job last year of canvassing all of our students thoughts about what they would like as a replacement. It will be so rewarding to see all of that decision making come to fruition next week. We have been told that the new playground should be ready for action by the following week.

While it is exciting to have these works starting, it will be a little unfortunate to have our second playground also out of action at the same time. This playground is fenced off due to fire safety related works which are being undertaken on the OSHC building and Junior Building over this term. This work will include painting the OSHC building with a fire retardant paint, replacing wooden garden edging with concrete edging, replacing the existing timber window frames with metal frames and landscaping.

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ADJUSTED TIMES

Over the beginning of this term we have been trialling a small adjustment to our daily timetable. In the past our students have been outside between 11:00am - 11:20am for recess and 1:30pm - 2:20pm for the lunch break. This term we have adjusted this to having recess from 11:00am to 11:30am and lunch from 1:40 - 2:20pm. This trial was for the following reasons:

- To reduce the amount of time spent outside for the longer break which is often at the hottest part of the day
- We had noticed that many playground issues were occurring in the last ten minutes of the larger playtime
- The extension of the recess allowed staff to have sufficient time to drink, eat and go to the bathroom (a particular issue previously for staff on yard duty)

The staff have been very positive about this change and have reported that the large majority of students are in favour of the adjustments - with some students not having even noticed the change. Some of our students have communicated that they are happy that they have more time at recess to fully get involved in their games and don't feel so rushed to finish their 'play lunch'.

Please be assured that all of our classes have food breaks between the start of the day and recess and again, between recess and lunch so they will not be starving by lunch time.

We discussed whether to make this a permanent change at our School Council meeting this week and it was unanimously agreed that we should lock this in as a permanent timetable change.

STUDENT PHOTO PERMISSION AND SCHOOL POLICY

Our school Photography, Filming and Recording Students Policy has been updated for 2025. This policy includes all current guidance and advice from the Department of Education and identifies:

- how Panton Hill Primary School collects, uses and discloses photographs, video and recordings of students
- when parent/carer consent is required before photographing, filming and recording students
- how consent can be provided and withdrawn.

We are currently experiencing some difficulties with our school website and the updated policy has been posted on XUNO today. We will update the policy on our website ASAP and inform the school community when this has occurred.

Families are able to provide consent for school photography, filming and recording for 2025 as of today on XUNO. Please contact the School Office if you need any further information about this.

Yesterday we conducted our bushfire drill and evacuated everyone onsite to the junior building (Shelter in Place). This is always a good opportunity to test all elements of our drill from the alarm, to lighting, to the movement of the students. We were really pleased to have everyone in the building withing six minutes of the alarm going off. I was especially impressed with how calm and ordered our teachers and students were. We hope never to have to execute this in a real situation but are very confident of the processes and the safety of our situation should we have to.

Our next Holiday Program (Autumn) will be available soon, so, keep an eye out for it and make a booking!



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
